CLUB PRESIDENT

KEVIN DENTITH



HOW DID YOU GET INTO ROWING AND WHEN DID YOU START?

Kevin: I was 11 years old fishing on the banks of the river Severn in Worcester when a pesky rowing boat went past for the 3rd time... I threw a load of maggots at them thinking 'they can't get to me'. But then, I heard a loud "Hey You!" - And their coach was behind me on the towpath! I thought I was going for a swim, but instead he invited me down to the club to have a go. I went, and spent the next 3 years coxing and sculling on the Severn until I moved to Devon with my family.

WHAT IS IT THAT YOU LIKE ABOUT ROWING AS A SPORT?

Kevin: Mainly the people. I have met some very good friends over the years, have been best man at the weddings' of 5 couples who met at the club, and made some friends for life. I also like coaching and seeing people develop, and as an engineer I like the technical aspects of the sport - as anyone who has been to my rigging workshops can testify!

WHEN AND WHY DID YOU JOIN ERC?

Kevin: When I was 19, I turned up at Exeter Regatta in 1976 - purely by chance whilst walking along the river. I met the Club Captain, a certain Paul Wilson, and before I knew it I was stroking an 8! Racing against Dart Totnes in the Under 20 event, we won by two feet and I needed some oxygen from St Johns Ambulance... up until that point I was smoking 20 a day - I gave up instantly.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN PRESIDENT OF THE CLUB?

Kevin: President is an honorary position and usually only for one year, but this is my 3rd year. We do have two other people in the wings, but they would rather wait until we have been through the restructuring - and I can understand that!

WHAT IS YOUR PROUDEST ACHIEVEMENT IN ROWING?

Kevin: There's quite a few and difficult to single out my proudest so if you don't mind I'll mention a few:

I've never made it big-time on the water, but I do have the club's fastest time for the Boston Marathon in a single, 3 hours 56 minutes! Only Neil Hitt has come close, and he will tell you I had better conditions the year I did it :-) So there's a challenge for our scullers!!

As Captain of the club for many years, we had some great successes in the late 1990's and 00's. We won 3 South Coast Championship events in 1996 and in the same year ERC was top of the UK league for number of wins in a season - with Lea RC coming a close second. I also coached Mel Moore to the world indoor title in Boston, USA and Harriet Rawlings won British Indoors for J15 - both went on to final GB trials

But I guess the proudest moments were being awarded British Rowing honours. One for Seniors Coach of the Year 2002, and the Medal Of Merit in 2012 - which was for my 10 years as Secretary of the National Coaching Committee, and 8 years as a Coach Educator delivering Level 2 courses and developing the Level 3 content with Rosie Mayglothling.

WHAT IS YOUR FUNNIEST ROWING MEMORY/DISASTER?

Kevin: I was in my single coaching a men's four, which included my good friend Justin Smallwood. We were doing a session to Turf, and whilst discussing the planned session at Lime Kilns, one of the crew by the name of MTB, said "Hey Deno (my nickname) is your gate undone?"... I had paddled from Double Locks with my stroke side gate open. I lent over to close it and fell in, the first and only time (so far!) in my sculling life... I could hear the crew laughing when I was under the water...

The junior winter training plan is in the full swing of things with circuits on a Tuesday, ergs on a Wednesday and Thursday, cardio on a Monday and regular time trialing and the building of mileage on the water at the weekends!

BOAT BOOKING OUT

The boat booking out sheets have now been replaced by a whiteboard booking out system - Kevin has accrued 6 months of data showing what boats are used during our busiest period and so the sheets are no longer required and the white board is better for us all to see at a quick glance who is out there, and where, which adds to all of our safety.

Please make sure you remember to remove your entry when you return otherwise you'll have a search party out for you!

ABANDONED KIT

Juniors: it's a terrible accusation to make, but the gently humming pile of (now neatly folded) kit at the back of the boathouse really is yours! It includes a lot of jazzy blue lycra. Please would you take it away over half term ... and wash it!



SCULLS STORAGE AT THE BACK OF THE BOATHOUSE

Di and Justin had a happy half hour re-arranging the sculling blades so that they lie neatly and are accessible on the horizontal racks at the back of the boathouse. This means that scullers can take and return their sculls without them ending up in a snotty heap on the floor because they've been stacked one on top of each other. In order to maintain this good order, scullers are asked to make sure that:

- There are no more than 3 pairs of sculls per rack apart from the small top rack at the rear which will only take 2 pairs.
- Sculls are laid so that there are 3 handles and 3 blades at each end and collars are slightly staggered. This makes best use of space available.
- There is no more room for more private sculls on these racks.
- Over time can tall scullers migrate their sculls to the higher racks.
- My apologies to anyone whose sculls have been moved as we juggled them around.


ERC ALUMNI


